CAMERON ROSE

Since 2008, Dr. Cameron Rose has served as the Director of Choral Activities at The University of Texas at Tyler, conducting the Patriot Singers and Concert Chorale in numerous highly attended concert performances each year. In January of 2019, he organized and is Music Director of CANTORI – Choral Artists of East Texas. Previously he served as founder and Music Director of the Utah Master Chorale, Assistant Conductor of the University of Utah Singers, and Assistant Conductor and Chorus Master of the American West Symphony and Chorus. He also previously served in professional arts administration with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and Hollywood Bowl.

As a composer, Dr. Rose's works have been performed by numerous ensembles and soloists, including the Tabernacle Choir and Orchestra at Temple Square, and Leticia Oaks Strong, Los Angeles Philharmonic violist. His music has also served as scores for award-winning media projects and the 2002 Salt Lake Winter Olympics. He is an accomplished pianist, including performance as the youngest of 84 "Rhapsody in Blue" pianists as part of the 1984 Los Angeles Summer Olympics Opening Ceremonies.

Dr. Rose graduated cum laude from Brigham Young University with a Bachelor of Music degree in Composition. He was a Graduate Fellow at the University of Minnesota earning a Masters of Arts in Composition, following which he completed an artist program in Scoring for Motion Pictures and Television at the University of Southern California. He earned his Doctorate of Musical Arts in Conducting from the University of Utah. He has been the student of many accomplished musicians including Mack Wilberg, Stephen Paulus, Dominick Argento, Elmer Bernstein and Brady Allred.

SARAH ROBERTS

From the Los Angeles Philharmonic to the O'Jays, saxophonist Sarah Roberts has a vast and diverse performing career that spans classical to jazz to popular music and all points in between. Within East Texas, Dr. Roberts frequently performs with her self-titled jazz quartet (Sarah Roberts Quartet) and The Jazz Connection. In February 2017, she formed a classical trio titled *Essimar*, that is dedicated to promoting new music with unusual instrumentation. In addition, she is a member of the Bar Band for Michael Tilson Thomas' composition *Playthings of the Wind* and has performed the work under the baton of MTT with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and The New World Symphony both in Miami and at Carnegie Hall. She has also shared the stage with such artists as Phil Woods, Tom Bones Malone, Wayne Bergeron, Kirk Whalum, Chris Vadala, Clay Jenkins, Johnyy Mathis, The O'Jays, and The Temptations. Furthermore, she has performed and lectured throughout the United States, Switzerland, France, and China.

In August 2014, Dr. Roberts began working at The University of Texas at Tyler as Assistant Professor of Saxophone and Jazz Studies. She completed her doctorate of musical arts degree in saxophone performance from the University of North Texas in august 2015. She also holds dual master of music degrees in saxophone performance and jazz studios from the University of North Texas and dual undergraduate degrees in saxophone performance and jazz studies from the University of Michigan. She is a Selmer Paris Performing Artist and a Vandoren Regional Artist and performs exclusively on Selmer and Vandoren products.
